**Reading:** As readers, students will work on responding to a text they have read in a variety of ways, including summarizing and identifying the main idea.

Writing: As writers, students will work on publishing their biographies.

Students will participate in think alouds and mini-lessons that focus on the organization and steps that go into solving a variety of multi- step word problems. Students will also identify facts families for three given numbers. This will help students solve related math word problems.
