Curriculum

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Reading: As readers, students will discuss how text features help readers determine the most important ideas (main idea) in a nonfiction text.

Writing: As writers, students will craft parts of an imagined narrative, developing a believable character by using various character traits and motivations. Students will write a story mountain of their narratives, too.

A Note From The Teachers

Math at Home

As we continue working with multiplication concepts using manipulatives, our students are discovering that multiplication is a faster way to add. While it is tempting to have your child memorize multiplication facts right now, it is imperative that your child is fluent with basic addition facts and eventually subtraction (for division). You might practice having your child skip count by 3s, 4s, 6s, 7s, 8s, 9s, etc. **Ex.:** 3, 6, 9, 12, 15, 18, 21... **Or, backwards:** 81, 72, 63, 54, 45, 36, 27, 18, 9, 0
