Curriculum

Reading: As readers, students will be reading and interpreting dramas to practice fluent reading skills, such as pace, expression and volume, phrasing, and smoothness. Students will also investigate words to discover shades or depths of meanings that words may have. (Ex.: said, shouted, muttered)

Writing: As writers, students will continue writing about their opinion pieces, considering their audience as they write.

Math: As mathematicians, students will continue learning about fraction concepts such as: comparing fractions with like denominators and investigating fractions that are equivalent.

Science: As scientists, students will begin to investigate how Earth's surface can be changed through various fast and slow changes.

A Note From The Teachers

Math Connection at Home: Families, as students continue investigating fractions, the concepts get harder. Students used number lines to show fractions between 0 and 1, last week. This week, they will begin exploring equivalent fractions and comparing fractions.
