Curriculum

Reading: As readers, students will practice summarizing a text and determining the author's message/central message by reading myths. They will also identify what makes a text a myth.

Writing: As writers, students will continue writing about their opinion pieces, checking in with their writing goals and looking for evidence of growth.

Math: As mathematicians, students will continue learning about fraction concepts such as: comparing fractions with like denominators and investigating fractions that are equivalent.

Science: As scientists, students will begin to investigate various weather concepts and tools that can be used to measure weather.

A Note From The Teachers

Math Connection at Home: Families, as students continue investigating fractions, the concepts get harder. Students used number lines to show fractions between 0 and 1, last week. This week, they will begin exploring equivalent fractions and comparing fractions. Visual representations (pictures) and math manipulatives are huge assets to your child's understanding of these concepts. You may support your child at home by practicing the following skills on IXL.
