Curriculum

Reading: As readers, students will analyze characters based on their actions, words, and thoughts. They will use this information, along with key story elements to begin investigating the author's message in a text.

Writing: As writers, students will explore nouns, adjectives, verbs and adverbs. They will begin using these within personal stories.

Math: As mathematicians, students will begin exploring addition and subtraction concepts within 1,000. They will use rounding and estimation concepts to check to see if their answer is reasonable.

Social Studies: As historians, students will discover what makes up a culture, taking a close look at the culture in their community and their world.

A Note From The Teachers

Math Facts: Your children are learning about adding and subtracting within 1,000. In order to be more successful with this, it is imperative that your child is fluent with his/her basic math facts for addition and subtraction.

What does it mean to be fluent with basic math facts? – This means that your child knows these from quick recall—within 3-5 seconds.

Math Strategies: Look for a strategy sheet coming home for adding and subtracting with regrouping—for parents. We hope you and your child can share your strategies with one another.
